Things to do in Dhaka

Landmarks & Monuments

Dhaka's iconic structures showcase centuries of architectural heritage and cultural significance. From Mughal-era buildings to colonial masterpieces, these landmarks tell the story of the city's rich past.



Ahsan Manjil (Pink Palace) Must See
1.5 hours No Booking Needed

A stunning **19th-century pink mansion** overlooking the Buriganga River. Built in 1872, this three-story palace combines Gothic, Mughal, and Baroque architectural styles. Now a museum showcasing period furniture, artwork, and historical artifacts from the Nawab family's era.



Star Mosque (Tara Masjid) Must See

A **19th-century mosque** renowned for its exquisite blue star-patterned tiles and intricate decorative work. Located in the old city, this intimate prayer space features stunning hand-painted ceramic tiles covering interior walls with geometric and floral patterns.



Lalbagh Fort Must See

A **17th-century Mughal fort** built in 1678 with impressive red sandstone structures and defensive walls. Features the Diwan-i-Aam (Hall of Commons), a mosque, and underground chambers. The fortress showcases Mughal military architecture and remains a significant historical monument.

Shahid Minar (Martyr's Monument) Must See

An iconic **56-meter tall monument** dedicated to those who died during the 1952 Language Movement. Built in 1954, this white marble structure has become a symbol of Bengali national pride and cultural identity. Beautifully illuminated at night.



Baitul Mukarram National Mosque Top Pick

One of Asia's **largest mosques**, built in 1965 with capacity for 24,000 worshippers. Features modern Islamic architecture with a spacious main prayer hall, beautiful geometric tile work, and a distinctive white marble courtyard providing a serene atmosphere for reflection.



Tips for Landmarks & Monuments

- Visit Lalbagh Fort early morning to avoid crowds and heat
- Dress modestly when visiting mosques; remove shoes before entering prayer areas
- Photography may be restricted in some religious sites; always ask permission
- Star Mosque is best photographed during golden hour for stunning tile reflections
- Combine visits to nearby monuments in the old city to minimize travel time



Museums & Galleries

Dhaka's museums preserve Bangladesh's rich cultural heritage, from ancient artifacts to contemporary art. Discover treasures spanning archaeology, history, textiles, and modern creative expression.



National Museum of Bangladesh Must See

Satyajit Ray Memorial Notable

Dedicated to the **legendary filmmaker**, this memorial showcases Satyajit Ray's personal belongings, film memorabilia, original scripts, and photographs. Houses archives of the acclaimed Indian director who drew inspiration from Bangladesh's culture and society.

Tips for Museums & Galleries

- Book tickets for Liberation War Museum in advance during peak season
- Many museums close on Mondays; verify operating days before visiting
- The National Museum has English-speaking guides available for hire
- Photography restrictions apply in some exhibitions; ask staff before photographing
- Plan museum visits during cooler morning or evening hours



Religious Sites

Dhaka's diverse religious architecture reflects the city's multicultural heritage. Ancient temples, grand mosques, and historic shrines offer spiritual experiences and architectural beauty across different faiths.



Dhakeshwari Temple Top Pick

Purana Paltan Mosque Top Pick

Curzon Hall Top Pick

Tips for Religious Sites

- Visitors of all faiths are welcome, but dress respectfully (covered shoulders, knees)
- Remove shoes before entering temples and prayer areas
- Avoid visiting during prayer times unless you wish to participate
- Photography inside religious buildings may be restricted; ask permission
- Visit during major festivals for authentic cultural experiences and celebrations



Neighborhoods & Districts

Old Dhaka (Puran Dhaka) Must See

The **historic heart of the city** featuring narrow winding streets, traditional wooden architecture, and centuries-old bazaars. Home to iconic monuments, traditional craftspeople, spice merchants, and textile traders. Chaotic, colorful, and intensely authentic—the soul of Dhaka.

Baishakhi Palli (Nakshi Kantha Lane) Top Pick

A charming **artistic neighborhood** famous for traditional Nakshi Kantha embroidery and handicrafts. Narrow lanes lined with artisan shops, galleries, and small eateries showcase traditional textiles. Tips for Neighborhoods & Districts

- Old Dhaka is best explored on foot or by rickshaw; avoid during peak traffic hours
- Hire a local guide to navigate Old Dhaka's maze-like streets and get insider access
- Visit markets early morning for best experience and fewer crowds
- Bring small change for local transactions; not all shops accept cards



- Respect locals' privacy when photographing; ask permission before taking pictures of people



Parks & Gardens

Dhaka's green spaces provide respite from urban congestion, offering peaceful gardens, recreational parks, and waterfront areas for relaxation and outdoor activities.

- Respect park rules and avoid photography in restricted areas

Unique **water-based market** (35km north) operating on inland waterways where merchants sell produce, fish, and goods from boats. Traditional trading method offering authentic glimpses into rural Bengali commerce and riverside life unchanged for generations.

Tips for Day Trips & Excursions

- Sundarbans requires permits and must be booked through licensed tour operators
- Book day trips in advance, especially during peak season (November-February)
- Bring sun protection, insect repellent, and appropriate footwear for outdoor activities
- Hire local guides familiar with areas and languages for better experiences



- Start early morning trips to maximize daylight and minimize travel time

Practical Information

Climate Overview

Dhaka experiences a **tropical monsoon climate** with three distinct seasons:

Winter (November-February)

Best time to visit. Temperatures range from **12-25°C (54-77°F)** with clear skies and minimal rainfall. Dry, pleasant weather perfect for sightseeing and outdoor activities. Festivities and cultural events peak during this season. Hotels and attractions are busier.

Spring (March-May)

Temperatures rise to **25-35°C (77-95°F)** with occasional pre-monsoon storms. Heat increases significantly by May. Less crowded than winter but less comfortable for daytime activities. Good for budget travelers seeking fewer tourists.

Summer/Monsoon (June-October)

Hot, humid, and wet with heavy rainfall, especially July-August. Temperatures reach **28-37°C (82-99°F)** with high humidity making outdoor exploration difficult. Flooding possible in low areas. Not recommended for general tourism, though monsoon reveals Dhaka's lush greenery. Budget accommodations available.

Getting Around Dhaka

Public Transportation

- **Rickshaws (Auto-rickshaws):** Three-wheeled motorized vehicles, the most popular local transport. Cheap (₹30-100 per trip), chaotic but quintessential Dhaka experience. Negotiate fares before boarding.
- **Taxis & Ride-hailing:** Apps like Uber, Pathao, and local taxis available. More reliable for tourists but pricier than rickshaws (₹150-500+ depending on distance).
- **Buses:** City buses connect major areas cheaply (₹15-50) but often overcrowded and slow. Requires local knowledge to navigate routes.
- **Metro Rail:** Limited metro system recently expanded with modern, comfortable trains. Efficient for specific routes at minimal cost (₹10-50).
- **Ferries:** Traditional water transport across rivers. Scenic and economical for riverside destinations.

Between Cities

- **Inter-city Buses:** Comfortable coaches connect Dhaka to other cities. Book through operators or online platforms.
- **Trains:** Rail network connects major destinations. Local and express options at varying speeds and prices.
- **Air Travel:** Biman Bangladesh Airlines and international carriers operate from Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport.

Within Attractions

Most monuments and museums are accessible on foot once reached. Old Dhaka requires walking on narrow streets. Wear comfortable shoes and stay hydrated.

➔ Airport Transfer

Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport (DAC) to city center:

- **Airport Taxi:** Metered or prepaid taxi to Gulshan or Banani in 30-45 minutes depending on traffic, around 600-900 BDT
- **Ride-hailing (Uber/Pathao):** App-based car to central Dhaka in 30-50 minutes, typically 400-700 BDT
- **Private Transfer/Hotel Car:** Pre-arranged private car to city hotels in 30-45 minutes, around 1200-2000 BDT



- **Airport Bus (BRTC):** Public bus service toward Gulistan/Motijheel running roughly every 20-30 minutes, about 40-60 BDT but slower due to traffic

Shopping in Dhaka

Traditional Markets (Bazaars)

- **Gulshan Market:** Modern shopping hub with boutiques, international brands, and local designer stores.
- **Baishakhi Palli:** Authentic artisan quarter for handcrafted textiles, Nakshi Kantha embroidery, and traditional crafts.
- **Old Dhaka Bazaars:** Chaotic traditional markets—Shakhari Bazaar for sweets, Chawkbazar for traditional goods, Sadar Lane for textiles and clothing.
- **Kawran Bazaar:** Wholesale market for traditional handicrafts, dried goods, and local products at bargain prices.

What to Buy

- **Textiles:** Nakshi Kantha embroidered fabrics, muslin cloth replicas, traditional sarees at unbeatable prices.
- **Handicrafts:** Pottery, metal work, bamboo items, wooden carvings from local artisans.
- **Food Items:** Sweets (Pitha, Rosogolla), spices, dried fish, specialty Bengal gram products.
- **Art & Souvenirs:** Contemporary art, rickshaw art reproductions, cultural memorabilia from museum shops.

Shopping Tips

- **Bargaining:** Expected in traditional markets and bazaars (haggle 20-40% off opening prices).
- **Fair Trade:** Support artisan cooperatives directly to ensure craftspeople receive fair compensation.
- **Authenticity:** Buy from established shops or directly from makers to avoid counterfeit products.
- **Hours:** Most shops open 10 AM-7 PM; markets busier morning and evening. Avoid midday crowds.
- **Payment:** Cash preferred in traditional markets; modern malls accept cards.

Festivals & Celebrations in Dhaka

Bengali New Year (Pahela Boishakh) - April 14

Vibrant celebration welcoming the Bengali calendar year. Traditional music, colorful processions, cultural performances, and street fairs dominate neighborhoods. Ramna Park hosts massive celebrations. Traditional food and clothing (Panjabi and Lungi) everywhere. Immersive cultural experience showcasing Bengali identity.

International Mother Language Day (Shahbag) - February 21

Commemorates Language Movement with midnight vigils at Shahid Minar, rallies, cultural performances, and memorial events. Markets close, flags displayed, and national pride is visible. Peaceful demonstrations and cultural shows fill the day.

Independence Day - March 26

National holiday celebrating 1971 independence. Official ceremonies, military parades, building illuminations, and public gatherings. Patriotic fervor, flag displays, and historical documentaries. Evening fireworks and cultural performances.

Eid al-Fitr & Eid al-Adha

Islamic festivals celebrated with prayers, family gatherings, special foods, and bazaar activities. Mosques overflow with worshippers. Markets bustle with Eid shopping. Festive atmosphere, meat distribution (Eid al-Adha), and traditional sweets everywhere.

Durga Puja (Autumn) - September-October

Hindu festival celebrated with elaborate pandal constructions, traditional rituals, and cultural performances. Dhakeshwari Temple hosts major celebrations. Colorful processions, traditional music, dance performances, and communal feasting.



Bangladesh National Day - December 16 (Bijoy Dibos)

Victory Day celebration commemorating 1971 war's conclusion. Official ceremonies, military parades, memorial services, and patriotic gatherings. Street decorations, flag hoisting, and public celebrations throughout the city.

- **Evening (5:00 PM):** Cycling or walking Hatirjheel promenade with scenic lake views.
- **Dinner (7:30 PM):** Waterfront restaurant with evening ambiance.

Best Photography & Instagram Locations

Golden Hour Magic (Best at Sunrise/Sunset)

- **Ahsan Manjil Pink Palace:** Stunning pink facade glows beautifully during sunset, especially when reflected in nearby water features. Arrive 30 minutes before sunset.
- **Buriganga River Waterfront:** Perfect sunset backdrops with boats, bridges, and river activity. Evening golden light transforms the industrial riverscape.
- **Shahid Minar:** Monument illumination creates dramatic lighting at dusk. Best photographed 30-45 minutes after sunset when lights enhance the white marble.

Street & Architecture Photography

- **Star Mosque Interior:** Intricate blue tile-work photographed during bright midday hours captures detail perfectly. Empty mornings offer uncluttered shots.
- **Old Dhaka Narrow Streets:** Chaotic, colorful scenes with traditional shopfronts, hanging textiles, and local life. Early morning provides best light and fewer crowds.
- **Rickshaw Art Lanes:** Vibrant hand-painted auto-rickshaws create vivid color compositions. Shoot against neutral backgrounds for maximum impact. Mid-morning light optimal.
- **Curzon Hall Facade:** Colonial Indo-Saracenic architecture best photographed with soft overcast light to capture architectural details without harsh shadows.

Cultural & Event Photography

- **Street Food Bazaars:** Authentic vendor scenes and colorful food displays. Early morning (6-8 AM) captures best activity and natural light without excessive crowds.
- **Festival Celebrations:** Pahela Boishakh processions and Durga Puja pandals offer vibrant cultural moments. Arrive early for exclusive access and better positioning.
- **Religious Rituals:** Temple ceremonies and mosque prayers offer profound cultural imagery. Ask permission before photographing; respect sacred moments.

Landscape & Nature Photography

- **Baldha Garden:** Botanical compositions with rare flowers and landscaping. Soft morning light illuminates foliage beautifully without harsh shadows.
- **Hatirjheel Lake:** Waterfront reflections during dawn create serene, mirror-like compositions. Overcast days produce best water reflections.
- **Ramna Park Pathways:** Tree-lined walks and garden compositions photographed during golden hours with selective focus on botanical details.

Photography Tips

- **Respect & Ethics:** Always ask permission before photographing people, religious ceremonies, or private spaces.
- **Light Management:** Dhaka's harsh midday sun requires seeking shade or shooting during early morning/late evening hours.
- **Gear Protection:** Monsoon humidity and dust can damage equipment; use protective cases and clean lenses regularly.
- **Permit Awareness:** Museums and temples may have photography restrictions; verify before shooting.

Electrical Standards & Adapters

Voltage & Frequency

220-240 volts, 50 Hz frequency across Bangladesh including Dhaka. All power supplied at this standard.

Plug Types

Bangladesh uses primarily **Type A** (2 flat pins) and **Type C** (2 round pins) plugs. Some locations may have **Type D** (3 round pins) British-style sockets.



Adapter Recommendations

- Bring universal travel adapters compatible with Type A, C, and D outlets for all eventualities.
- Multi-outlet power banks enable charging multiple devices simultaneously without multiple adapters.
- Voltage converters (220V to 110V) needed only for North American appliances; most modern chargers auto-convert.

Power Supply Reliability

- Dhaka generally has stable electricity in tourist areas and modern hotels.
- Power cuts (load shedding) possible during peak demand hours; keep devices charged.
- Battery-operated backup lights recommended for extended outages.
- Hotels provide adapters upon request; plan charging during stable hours.

Safety Considerations

- Avoid overloading outlets with multiple high-power devices simultaneously.
- Use surge protectors for valuable electronics protection against voltage fluctuations.
- Never touch electrical outlets or wiring with wet hands.
- Report any damaged outlets immediately to hotel staff.

Food Culture & Must-Try Dishes

Street Food Staples

- **Fuchka (Golgappa):** Crispy hollow bread spheres filled with spiced mashed potatoes, lentils, and tamarind water. Tangy, crunchy, addictive snack. ₹20-50.
- **Chotpoti:** Spiced mixture of potatoes, eggs, and chickpeas with tamarind sauce. Savory street snack enjoyed with bread. ₹30-60.
- **Pani Puri:** Water-filled bread puffs with spiced potato filling. Refreshing, light snack. ₹15-40.
- **Jhal Muri:** Puffed rice mixed with potatoes, peas, mustard, and spices. Savory snack from street vendors. ₹20-50.

Main Dishes

- **Biryani:** Fragrant rice dish with meat (chicken/mutton), cooked with aromatic spices. Dhaka's biryani is world-famous. ₹150-300 per plate.
- **Bhuna Khichuri:** Rice and lentil comfort food cooked with vegetables and spices. Nutritious, flavorful, authentic Bengali dish. ₹80-150.
- **Hilsa Fish Curry:** National fish prepared in mustard sauce or traditional curry. Delicate, flavorful, seasonal specialty. ₹200-400.
- **Beef Curry:** Tender beef slow-cooked in onion-tomato gravy with aromatic spices. Hearty, satisfying dish. ₹180-300.

Desserts & Sweets

- **Rosogolla:** Spongy cottage cheese balls in sugar syrup. Sweet, light, iconic Bengali dessert. ₹50-100 per serving.
- **Sandesh:** Compressed cottage cheese sweet with various flavors and textures. Traditional confection. ₹40-80.
- **Mishti Doi:** Sweet yogurt in terracotta cups. Creamy, caramel-flavored authentic Bengali dessert. ₹40-70.
- **Pitha:** Rice cake variations (sweet and savory) traditional during festivals. ₹30-80.

Dining Tips

- **Hygiene Awareness:** Eat street food from busy vendors with high turnover ensuring freshness. Avoid questionable cleanliness.
- **Spice Levels:** Request reduced spice if unaccustomed to Bengali heat. Most restaurants accommodate preferences.
- **Restaurant Categories:** High-end restaurants in Gulshan (₹600-1500+), mid-range in Banani/Dhanmondi (₹300-600), street food (₹30-150).
- **Drinking Water:** Consume only purified/bottled water; most hotels provide filtered water freely.



- **Vegetarian Options:** Readily available in Bangladesh; mention dietary requirements to restaurants upfront.
- **Payment:** Cash accepted everywhere; upscale restaurants accept cards. Tipping: 5-10% at restaurants, rounding for street vendors.

Tourist Passes

Dhaka Heritage Pass

A comprehensive pass providing **discounted entry** to major museums and historical monuments over a 3-day period. Includes National Museum, Ahsan Manjil, Lalbagh Fort, and Liberation War Museum. **Cost: ₹1000-1500** providing approximately 30-40% savings versus individual tickets.
