## Things to do in Guangzhou

### Landmarks & Monuments

Guangzhou's most iconic structures symbolizing the city's evolution from historic trading hub to modern metropolis. These landmarks represent centuries of culture and contemporary architectural achievement.



Must See Book Ahead

#### Canton Tower (Guangzhou TV Tower)

2-3 hours Book Ahead

Standing at **600 meters**, this is one of the world's tallest TV towers offering **panoramic city views** from the observation decks. The tower features a rotating restaurant, 4D cinema, and thrilling activities like the **Vertigo free-fall experience**. Best visited at dusk for sunset and city lights.

#### People's Square (Renmin Square)

1-2 hours No Booking Needed

The heart of Guangzhou featuring the iconic **Monument to the Martyrs of the Canton Uprising**. This vast public space hosts cultural events and offers excellent people-watching. Surrounded by government buildings and museums, it's perfect for understanding modern Chinese civic architecture and political history.

#### Five Rams Statue (Symbol of Guangzhou)

30 minutes No Booking Needed

The legendary **five celestial rams** statue is Guangzhou's iconic symbol, representing prosperity and abundance. Located in Yuexiu Park, this statue commemorates the mythical founding of the city. It has become one of the most photographed landmarks, especially beautiful when illuminated at night.

### Tips for Landmarks & Monuments

- Visit Canton Tower at sunset for best photography lighting
- Book tickets online in advance to skip queues
- People's Square is best explored early morning or evening
- The statue is illuminated beautifully after 7 PM

## Guangzhou Museum

## Six Banyan Tree Temple

## Islamic Mosque (Huaisheng Mosque)

One of China's oldest mosques dating to the **7th century**, built during the Tang Dynasty. Featuring **Islamic architectural elements** with a distinctive minaret tower. The peaceful courtyard and prayer halls offer insight into Guangzhou's Muslim community and historical Silk Road connections.

## Tips for Religious Sites

- Dress respectfully with covered shoulders and knees
- Remove shoes in temple prayer areas; follow posted customs
- Visit early morning for peaceful atmosphere and better photography
- Ask permission before photographing; some areas may be restricted



# Parks & Gardens

## Yuexiu Park

## Practical Information

### Best Times to Visit Guangzhou

**Autumn (September-November):** Mild temperatures (20-28°C), low humidity, and clear skies create perfect conditions. Comfortable for outdoor exploration without excessive heat.

**Spring (March-May):** Pleasant temperatures (18-26°C) with occasional rain. Flowers bloom, creating beautiful scenery. Watch for occasional rainy days.

**Summer (June-August):** Hot and humid (28-35°C) with frequent rain and occasional typhoons. Air-conditioned indoor attractions become essential. Less crowded due to heat.

**Winter (December-February):** Cool but rarely freezing (10-20°C). Relatively dry with occasional cold fronts. Comfortable for most activities. Chinese New Year typically falls in February, bringing festive atmosphere.

**Avoid:** Typhoon season (July-September) and peak Chinese holiday periods when crowds surge.



## Getting Around Guangzhou

**Metro System:** Modern, efficient, and extensive **subway network** covering the entire city. Cards purchased at any station work for unlimited rides. Most signs include English. Extremely affordable and reliable.

**Buses:** Comprehensive bus system connecting all areas. Local buses are inexpensive but often crowded. English signage limited; use transit apps like Amap or Baidu Maps.

**Taxis & Rideshare:** Abundant and affordable taxis with meters. Didi (Chinese rideshare) app works with local payment methods. Uber no longer operates in mainland China.

**Bicycles:** Bike-sharing programs available citywide; scan QR codes with WeChat or Alipay to unlock.

**Airport Transfer:** Guangzhou Baiyun International Airport connects to city via metro line (about 30 minutes), buses, or taxis (45 minutes, depending on traffic).

### ➔ Airport Transfer

**Guangzhou Baiyun International Airport (CAN)** to city center:

- **Metro Line 3:** Direct service to city center stations like Zhujiang New Town in about 40 minutes, tickets cost roughly 7-10 CNY
- **Airport Express Bus:** Multiple routes to downtown drop-off points in 45-60 minutes, tickets cost around 16-30 CNY depending on route
- **Taxi:** Metered taxi to city center takes about 45 minutes and costs roughly 100-150 CNY including expressway tolls
- **Private transfer:** Pre-booked car service to your hotel takes about 40-50 minutes and costs around 250-350 CNY

## Shopping in Guangzhou

**What to Buy:** Traditional Chinese items including porcelain, scrolls, tea sets, silk products, jade carvings, and antiques. Local Cantonese products like preserved fruits, tea, and traditional medicine. Modern electronics and clothing at wholesale prices.

**Shopping Areas:** Shangxiajiu Street for mainstream shopping; Shamian Island for trendy boutiques and art galleries; Liurong district for antiques and traditional goods; Pearl River New City for luxury malls.

**Bargaining Tips:** Expected in markets and older shops, but not in modern malls. Start at 60-70% of asking price and negotiate upward. Smile, be respectful, and be prepared to walk away. Payment in cash gives additional negotiating leverage.

**Payment Methods:** WeChat Pay and Alipay are standard everywhere, even for small purchases. Foreign credit cards often not accepted; carry cash as backup. Mobile payment apps require Chinese bank accounts or special tourist options.

## Festivals & Events in Guangzhou

**Chinese New Year (Late January-Early February):** The city explodes with celebrations. Temple fairs, parades, fireworks, family gatherings, and special foods dominate. Many businesses close for several days. Decorations and festive atmosphere throughout the city.

**Qingming Festival (April):** Grave-sweeping day when families honor ancestors. Parks are busy; many attractions see increased visitors seeking renewal of nature during spring.

**Dragon Boat Festival (June):** Thrilling dragon boat races on the Pearl River. Sticky rice dumplings (zongzi) are traditionally eaten. Races attract thousands of spectators.

**Mid-Autumn Festival (September-October):** Celebrated with lanterns, mooncakes, and family gatherings. Parks host lantern shows and cultural performances. Beautiful nighttime celebrations throughout the city.

**Canton Fair (Spring & Fall):** World's largest trade fair attracting international business people. While primarily B2B, the atmosphere brings business travelers and energy to hotels and restaurants.



## Sample 5-Day Guangzhou Itinerary

**Day 1 - Historic Guangzhou:** Start at People's Square and Monument to Martyrs. Visit Guangzhou Museum in Zhenhai Tower. Lunch at local dim sum restaurant. Afternoon stroll through nearby parks and historic streets. Evening walk on Shamian Island, sunset photography, dinner at island restaurants.

**Day 2 - Spiritual & Cultural:** Visit Six Banyan Tree Temple and climb the pagoda. Explore Huaisheng Mosque. Lunch near historic quarter. Afternoon at Guangdong Museum or Guangzhou Art Museum. Evening at Liwan Lake Park for sunset and traditional pavilions.

**Day 3 - Modern Guangzhou & Sky Views:** Take metro to Canton Tower. Spend morning/afternoon ascending levels, visiting observation decks, and enjoying rotating restaurant or activities. Shop at nearby malls. Evening stroll around tower base. Night Pearl River cruise.

**Day 4 - Markets & Neighborhoods:** Early morning exploration of Liurong antique market and historic trading quarter. Late morning Shangxiajiu Street shopping. Lunch at traditional Cantonese restaurant. Afternoon in Xiguan neighborhood. Cooking class or local food experience in evening.

**Day 5 - Nature & Day Trip:** Metro to Yuexiu Park for early morning walks. Visit Five Rams Statue. Late morning drive/bus to nearby Conghua Hot Springs, Foshan ancestral halls, or Shishan ancient town. Return evening.

## Best Photography Locations

**Canton Tower (Sunrise/Sunset/Night):** Observation decks offer 360-degree city views at golden hour. Night photography reveals dramatic city lighting. Interior architecture provides interesting geometric compositions.

**Pearl River at Night:** Embankments and bridges frame illuminated skyline perfectly. Best at 7-9 PM when all lights activate. River cruises offer unique water-level perspectives. Shamian Island waterfront offers atmospheric shots.

**Yuexiu Park - Five Rams Statue:** Golden hour light creates beautiful shadows and highlights. Night illumination provides dramatic backdrop. Surrounding landscape offers natural framing for sculptural photography.

**Shamian Island - Colonial Architecture:** Tree-lined streets with European buildings create timeless atmosphere. Early morning soft light flatters historic facades. Narrow alleys offer intimate, textured photography opportunities.

**Liurong Historic District - Street Photography:** Narrow lanes, traditional signage, and daily commerce create vibrant street scenes. Early morning and late afternoon light filters beautifully through buildings. Markets offer colorful, dynamic subject matter.

## Electricity & Adapters

**Voltage: 220 Volts AC, 50 Hz** throughout China, including Guangzhou. Most modern electronics handle 110-240V input, but verify your device before plugging in.

**Plug Types:** China uses primarily **Type I plugs** (two angled flat pins) and **Type A/B plugs** (three rectangular pins in triangular arrangement). Some older outlets may use Type C (two round pins).

**Adapter & Converter Recommendations:** Universal travel adapters covering Type I and Type C are essential. Purchase adapters before traveling or at airport duty-free shops. Quality matters for multiple/expensive devices. Consider surge protectors with multiple outlets for hotel room charging.

**Using Appliances:** Check voltage compatibility before using hair dryers, electric shavers, or other heat-generating devices. Many hotels provide adapters at front desk upon request. Bring adapter redundancy since backup adapters are difficult to find mid-travel.



## Must-Try Guangzhou Food

**Dim Sum (Yum Cha):** Guangzhou's most famous culinary gift to the world. Small plates of steamed dumplings, noodle rolls, and small bites served with tea. Traditional dim sum restaurants serve carts of dishes to tables. Peak hours are 9 AM-1 PM and 5-7 PM weekdays; weekends are extremely crowded.

**Roasted Meats: Roasted duck, pig, and chicken** are Cantonese specialties. Meat hangs in shop windows with glossy lacquered skin. Served with rice, noodles, or steamed buns. Intensely flavorful and quintessentially Guangzhou.

**Clay Pot Rice:** Rice cooked in earthenware pots with meat, vegetables, and soy sauce. Creates crispy bottom layer (rice crust) that's prized. Comfort food deeply embedded in Cantonese culture.

**Fresh Seafood:** Guangzhou's Pearl River location means abundant fresh fish, shrimp, and shellfish. Restaurants often feature live tanks for selection. Steamed or stir-fried preparations highlight fresh flavors.

**Soups & Broths:** Cantonese soups are medicinal tonics emphasizing balance and health. Slow-cooked herbal broths, winter melon soups, and bird's nest soups feature in restaurants and home cooking.

**Street Food:** Jianbing (crepes), youtiao (fried dough), soy milk, egg tarts, and steamed buns available at street stalls. Inexpensive, flavorful, and authentic local dining experiences.

## Tourist Passes

### Guangzhou Metro Card

Reloadable smart card for metro, buses, and some taxis. Purchase at metro stations for **30-50 RMB (with initial balance)**. Valid throughout metro system and partner transportation. One-time purchase provides unlimited travel. Refundable deposit included in price.
