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Things to do in Larnaca

Religious Sites

Larnaca's religious and historical landmarks tell the story of millennia of civilization, from early Christian saints to Ottoman architecture. These sacred sites showcase stunning Byzantine art, medieval fortifications, and spiritual significance that continues to draw pilgrims and history enthusiasts from around the world.



Must See

Church of Saint Lazarus (Agios Lazaros)

45-60 minutes No Booking Needed

This magnificent **9th-century Byzantine church** stands as one of Cyprus's most important religious monuments. According to Christian tradition, it was built over the tomb of **Lazarus of Bethany**, whom Jesus raised from the dead. After his resurrection, Lazarus became the first Bishop of Kition and lived here for 30 years. The church features stunning stone architecture, a beautiful iconostasis, and an impressive bell tower added in the 1850s. The interior houses precious icons and the saint's marble sarcophagus. Located in the heart of **Saint Lazarus Square**, surrounded by charming cafes and shops, it serves as both a spiritual center and cultural landmark. The church's central location makes it easily accessible from the Finikoudes promenade.



Top Pick

Hala Sultan Tekke

45 minutes No Booking Needed

Situated on the western shore of Larnaca Salt Lake, this **important Islamic pilgrimage site** is one of the holiest Muslim shrines. The mosque, also known as the *Mosque of Umm Haram*, was built over the tomb of Umm Haram, the wet nurse of Prophet Muhammad and wife of Ouvadas Ibn. According to tradition, she fell from her mule and died here during the first Arab raids on Cyprus in 649 AD. The complex features beautiful Ottoman architecture with a distinctive minaret, peaceful gardens with ancient trees, and serene courtyards. The setting beside the salt lake creates a picturesque scene, especially during winter when flamingos gather nearby. The mosque dates back to 1816 but stands on a site that has been sacred since the 7th century.



Top Pick

Larnaca Medieval Castle

1 hour No Booking Needed

This **fortress-turned-museum** guards the southern end of Finikoudes Beach and dates back to the late 14th century, built during Lusignan rule. The castle was later strengthened by the Ottomans in 1625. Throughout history, it served multiple purposes: a fortress, prison, and even a gallows during Ottoman times. Today, it houses the **Larnaca Medieval Museum** with exhibits showcasing medieval artifacts, weapons, pottery, and photographs documenting the castle's history. The battlements offer excellent views of the marina and coastline. The castle's strategic location at the old harbor made it a crucial defensive structure. Visitors can explore the inner courtyard, prison cells, and museum galleries that bring medieval Cyprus to life.

Tips for Religious Sites

- **Dress modestly** when visiting religious sites – cover shoulders and knees at churches and mosques
- Visit early morning or late afternoon to avoid midday heat and crowds



- Hala Sultan Tekke has **specific opening hours**: Winter (Sept-Mar) 8am-12pm & 2pm-5pm, Summer (Apr-Aug) 8am-12pm & 3pm-6pm
- Photography is allowed but be respectful, especially during services
- Saint Lazarus Church often hosts beautiful Orthodox ceremonies worth attending



Ancient & Historical Sites

Larnaca sits atop the ancient city-kingdom of Kition, founded in the 13th century BCE. Archaeological excavations have revealed remarkable remains of this Bronze Age civilization, including Phoenician temples and cyclopean walls. These sites provide fascinating glimpses into Cyprus's role as a crossroads of Mediterranean civilizations.



Top Pick

Kamares Aqueduct (Bekir Pasha Aqueduct)

30 minutes No Booking Needed

This magnificent **18th-century Ottoman aqueduct** stands as one of Larnaca's most photogenic landmarks. Commissioned by Ottoman Governor Bekir Pasha in 1746 and completed in 1748, it was built using classical Roman architectural techniques. The aqueduct solved Larnaca's chronic freshwater problems by transporting water from springs 15km away through an ingenious system combining **underground channels (8km)** and overland arches (7km). The surviving **75 arches**, known locally as "Kamares," stretch impressively along the old Limassol road. Some historians believe it may have been built atop or using stones from an earlier Roman structure. The aqueduct remained operational until the 1950s and now serves as a popular backdrop for evening concerts and cultural events, beautifully illuminated at night.



Notable

Ancient Kition Archaeological Site

45 minutes No Booking Needed

The sparse but significant ruins of **Kition** (Area II) represent what remains of the original city-kingdom established around 1300 BCE. The Phoenicians rebuilt the city around 1000 BCE, and their influence is evident in the excavated structures. Visitors can see impressive **cyclopean walls** constructed from massive limestone blocks, foundations of ancient temples dedicated to the goddess Astarte, and remains of copper workshops that highlight Kition's importance in Bronze Age trade. The site includes five temples and evidence of sophisticated urban planning. Much of ancient Kition lies beneath modern Larnaca, making this archaeological area particularly precious. The birthplace of the Stoic philosopher **Zeno of Citium** (334 BCE), founder of the famous Stoic school of philosophy in Athens.

Tips for Ancient & Historical Sites

- Visit Kamares Aqueduct during **golden hour** (sunrise or sunset) for stunning photography
- The aqueduct is **free to access** and open 24/7
- Combine your visit with a walk along the Salt Lake path for scenic views
- Kition site hours depend on archaeological work – check ahead
- Bring water and sun protection as archaeological sites have limited shade



Beaches & Coastal Areas

Larnaca's coastline offers pristine Mediterranean beaches with crystal-clear waters, while the famous Salt Lake provides a unique natural spectacle. The city's beaches are perfect for swimming, water sports, and relaxation, while the lake attracts thousands of migratory birds, creating unforgettable wildlife viewing opportunities.



Must See

Finikoudes Beach & Promenade

2-3 hours No Booking Needed

Finikoudes (meaning "little palm trees") is Larnaca's iconic palm-lined promenade and main beach. This bustling waterfront stretches along Athenon Avenue, featuring a beautiful sandy beach with calm, clear waters perfect for swimming. The promenade is lined with countless cafes, restaurants, and bars offering sea views. It's the heart of Larnaca's social life, especially vibrant in the evenings when locals and tourists stroll along the palm-tree-lined walkway. The beach offers sunbeds and umbrellas for rent, water sports facilities, and gentle waters ideal for families. The promenade features a bust of Kimon the Athenian with the inscription "*Even in death he was victorious.*" This is the perfect spot to enjoy Cypriot coffee, watch the sunset, or simply people-watch while experiencing the city's laid-back Mediterranean atmosphere.



Must See

Larnaca Salt Lake

1-2 hours No Booking Needed

This stunning **natural wetland complex** consists of four interconnected salt lakes covering a vast area west of the city. During winter months (November to March), the lake fills with water and becomes home to approximately **10,000-85,000 flamingos** and 85 other migratory waterbird species. The spectacle of pink flamingos against the lake's reflective waters with Hala Sultan Tekke mosque in the background creates one of Cyprus's most iconic scenes. In summer (July-August), the lake completely dries up, leaving a thick white salt crust up to 10cm deep. Historically, salt was commercially mined here during medieval times. The lake is surrounded by walking and cycling paths offering excellent bird-watching opportunities and photography spots. The area is protected as an important **Natura 2000 site**.



Must See

Book Ahead

Zenobia Wreck Diving Site

Full day (2 dives) Book Ahead

Rated among the **Top 10 wreck dives in the world**, the MS Zenobia is Larnaca's crown jewel for underwater exploration. This 172-meter Swedish roll-on/roll-off ferry sank on her maiden voyage on **June 7, 1980**, just 1.5km offshore, due to computer malfunctions in the ballast system. She rests on her port side at depths of 16-42 meters, making her accessible to divers of various skill levels. The wreck still contains **104 articulated lorries with cargo** destined for Syria, creating an eerie time capsule. Key features include massive propellers, intact lifeboats, the bridge, cafeteria with original kettles, accommodation areas, and cargo holds. The site is protected – **no fishing within 3 miles** – resulting in rich marine life including huge groupers, barracuda, tuna, sea bream, triggerfish, and occasional turtles. Visibility often exceeds 30 meters. *Advanced Open Water certification required.*





Top Pick

Mackenzie Beach

Half day No Booking Needed

Located near Larnaca Airport, **Mackenzie Beach** offers a unique experience for aviation enthusiasts and beach lovers alike. This popular sandy beach provides **spectacular views of planes landing and taking off** just overhead, making it one of the most distinctive beach experiences in Cyprus. The beach features golden sand, clear turquoise waters, excellent swimming conditions, and a vibrant atmosphere. The area is packed with trendy beach bars, seafood tavernas, and restaurants serving fresh local cuisine. Mackenzie is particularly lively during summer evenings with music and entertainment. The beach offers full facilities including sunbeds, umbrellas, water sports, and lifeguards during summer months. It's perfect for those seeking a more energetic beach scene compared to the family-friendly Finikoudes.



Notable

Larnaca Marina

1-2 hours No Booking Needed

The modern **Larnaca Marina** serves as the departure point for all dive trips, boat excursions, and yacht charters. This full-service marina accommodates over 450 vessels and offers excellent facilities for sailors and visitors. The waterfront area features upscale restaurants, cafes, shops, and a pleasant promenade perfect for evening strolls. From here, various boat tours depart including **glass-bottom boat trips** to view the Zenobia from the surface, coastal cruises, fishing charters, and sunset sailing tours. The marina district has undergone significant development, becoming a hub for maritime tourism. It's conveniently located near Larnaca Castle and the old town, making it easy to combine a marina visit with historical sightseeing.

Tips for Beaches & Coastal Areas

- **Best time for flamingos:** January-February when the largest flocks arrive
- Bring **binoculars and telephoto lens** for bird watching and photography
- Visit Salt Lake at **sunrise or sunset** for magical light and fewer crowds
- All beaches have free access; you only pay for sunbed and umbrella rentals (€5-7/day)
- Mackenzie Beach restaurants are more expensive but offer airplane views
- Swimming season: May-October with water temperatures 20-28°C
- **Zenobia diving costs:** €90-120 for 2 dives including equipment with reputable operators
- Book dive trips **48 hours in advance** during peak season (June-September)
- Water temperature: 16-20°C in winter, 24-28°C in summer – wetsuits recommended year-round
- Best diving months: **June-October** for warmest water and best visibility
- **Discover Scuba** programs available for beginners (max depth 12m, cannot dive Zenobia)
- Allow 24 hours between last dive and flying
- Recommended dive centers: Alpha Divers, Viking Divers, Dive-In Larnaca



Museums & Galleries

Larnaca's museums preserve and showcase the island's rich cultural heritage, from ancient civilizations to modern history. These institutions offer air-conditioned respite from the heat while providing educational insights into Cypriot art, archaeology, and traditions.



Optional

Larnaca Archaeological Museum

45 minutes No Booking Needed

This compact but informative museum houses an extensive collection of artifacts spanning **6,000 years of Cypriot history**. The exhibits include pottery, terracotta figures, jewelry, glassware, and sculptures from Neolithic times through the Roman period. Notable pieces include finds from ancient Kition, Bronze Age ceramics, and Phoenician artifacts. The collection provides context for understanding the archaeological sites around Larnaca. While the museum is relatively small and signage could be improved, it offers valuable insights into the region's layered history. The museum building itself is a neoclassical structure. Perfect for history enthusiasts wanting to understand the significance of Larnaca's ancient past before visiting the ruins.



Optional

Kyriazis Medical Museum

45 minutes No Booking Needed

A unique specialty museum showcasing the evolution of medicine and surgery from ancient times to the modern era. This fascinating collection includes **historical medical instruments, surgical tools, pharmaceutical equipment**, and anatomical models. The exhibits demonstrate how medical practices have evolved over centuries, with particular focus on Cypriot medical history. Displays include antique apothecary jars, early diagnostic equipment, dental instruments, and historical photographs. The museum offers a rare glimpse into the history of healthcare that few visitors expect to find in Larnaca. It's housed in a traditional building and provides an interesting alternative to the typical tourist attractions, appealing to those with interests in medical history or science.

Tips for Museums & Galleries

- Museum opening hours typically: Tuesday-Friday 9am-2:30pm, Saturday 10am-1pm, **closed Sundays and Mondays**
- Admission fees are modest: €2.50-4.50 per adult
- Museums offer air-conditioned comfort – perfect for midday heat escape
- Photography usually allowed but check specific museum policies
- Limited English descriptions – consider hiring a guide for deeper understanding



Neighborhoods & Districts

Tips for Neighborhoods & Districts

- **Best time to explore Old Town:** Early morning (8-10am) or evening (6-9pm) to avoid midday heat
- Saint Lazarus Square hosts **seasonal markets** including Christmas market in December
- Parking is limited in Old Town – consider walking from your hotel or using public transport
- Many traditional shops close during siesta (2-5pm)
- Old Town restaurants often offer better value than beachfront establishments

Annual Events & Festivals

Orthodox Easter (March/April - varies): The most important religious celebration with candlelit processions, special services at Saint Lazarus Church, traditional foods. Dates vary annually based on Orthodox calendar.

Kataklysmos Festival (June): Ancient "Festival of the Flood" celebrated 50 days after Orthodox Easter. Water-based festivities, boat races, folk music and dance, food stalls along Finikoudes. One of Cyprus's most vibrant cultural events.

Larnaca Summer Festival (July-August): Month-long program of concerts, theater performances, dance, art exhibitions at various venues including medieval castle and cultural centers.

International Marathon (November): Annual event attracting runners globally, with full marathon, half marathon, 10K, 5K races along the scenic coastal route.

Christmas Market (early December): Festive market with 200+ stalls in Old Town center around Saint Lazarus Square. Handmade crafts, traditional foods, entertainment. Operating hours: Friday 5-10pm, Saturday-Sunday 3-10pm.

New Year's Eve (December 31): Major celebrations on Finikoudes Promenade with live music, fireworks, outdoor parties.

Agios Lazaros Feast Day (Saturday before Palm Sunday): Special religious processions and services honoring Saint Lazarus with the icon carried through Old Town streets.

Wreckfest (dates vary): Week-long diving event centered on Zenobia wreck exploration, underwater photography competitions, environmental awareness activities.

Must-Try Dishes

Meze: The ultimate Cypriot dining experience - 20-30 small sharing plates served in succession. Available as meat meze, fish meze, or vegetarian meze. Typically €18-25 per person. Perfect for groups. Pace yourself - it's a marathon!

Halloumi: Cyprus's signature cheese, semi-hard, perfect for grilling. Served grilled, fried, in salads, or in traditional dishes. Must-try!

Souvlaki: Small chunks of marinated meat (pork, chicken, lamb) grilled on skewers. The most popular dish. Often served in pitta bread with salad.

Sheftalia: Cypriot sausages made from minced pork wrapped in caul fat, grilled over charcoal. Aromatic with herbs and spices.

Kleftiko: Slow-cooked lamb falling off the bone, baked for hours in traditional clay oven with potatoes and herbs. Fork-tender and flavorful.

Moussaka: Layered dish with minced meat, eggplant, potatoes, and béchamel sauce. Cypriot version includes halloumi and mint.

Koupepia (Dolmades): Vine leaves stuffed with rice, minced meat, and herbs. Can be served hot or cold.

Stifado: Slow-cooked beef or rabbit stew with baby onions, red wine, and aromatic spices.

Tavas: Traditional one-pot meal with mixed lamb and beef, potatoes, onions, tomatoes, and spices.

Baklava: Sweet pastry dessert with layers of phyllo, nuts, and honey syrup. Rich and delicious.

Loukoumades: Fried dough balls soaked in honey syrup, served with cinnamon - addictive!

Intercity Bus Pass

For travelers planning multiple day trips from Larnaca, the **Intercity Bus Multi-Journey Card** offers discounted fares on routes connecting major cities. Particularly useful if visiting Ayia Napa, Nicosia, Limassol, or Paphos by public transport. Individual journey tickets: €3-7 depending on distance. Multi-journey cards offer approximately **20-30% savings**. Available at bus stations and online. Download the Cyprus By Bus app for schedules and real-time tracking. *Note: Car rental may offer better value and flexibility for extensive exploring, especially for groups.*
