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Things to do in Turku

Landmarks & Monuments

Turku is home to Finland's most iconic historical landmarks, including the impressive Turku Castle and the soaring Gothic cathedral that dominates the skyline.



Turku Castle Must See
2-3 hours No Booking Needed

A magnificent **medieval fortress** dating back to 1280, Turku Castle stands as one of Finland's most important historical monuments. Turku Cathedral Must See

Cathedral Church of Turku

Church of St. Michael

Practical Information

Seasonal Overview

Summer (June-August): Peak season with **midnight sun** phenomenon, warm temperatures (15-22°C), vibrant outdoor events, and all attractions fully operational. Book accommodations well in advance as the city attracts numerous visitors.

Spring (April-May): Mild weather, blooming flowers in botanical gardens, fewer tourists, and moderate prices. Excellent for photography and enjoying nature's awakening.

Autumn (September-October): Beautiful fall colors, comfortable temperatures (5-15°C), cultural festivals, and fewer crowds. Spectacular for landscape photography and experiencing Nordic atmosphere.

Winter (November-March): Dark, cold weather (-5 to 0°C), but offers northern lights opportunities, festive markets, and winter activities. Many outdoor attractions have reduced hours; focus on museums and indoor activities.



Getting Around Turku

Public Transport: Efficient bus network covering the entire city. Purchase a day ticket for unlimited travel or travel cards valid across multiple journeys. Trams serve central areas.

Walking: City center is highly walkable with attractions clustered within 1-2km. Well-maintained pedestrian infrastructure and clear signage.

Cycling: Extensive bike paths throughout the city. Bicycle rental services available at multiple locations. Flat terrain makes cycling accessible for all fitness levels.

Taxis & Ride-sharing: Uber and local taxi services available. Reliable and reasonably priced for longer distances or evening travel.

Boat Transport: Regular ferry services to surrounding islands and archipelago destinations. Ferries serve as both transportation and scenic experiences.

Airport Transfer: Turku Airport located 4km north. Bus connections to city center run frequently (€3-5). Taxi transfers available (~€20).

➔ Airport Transfer

Turku Airport (TKU) to city center:

- **Bus route 1 (Föli):** City bus to Turku city centre in about 20 minutes, single ticket 3 euros
- **Airport shuttle bus:** Direct express service to Turku Market Square and harbor in around 15 minutes, roughly 8 euros
- **Taxi:** Metered taxi to city centre takes about 15 minutes and costs around 30 to 35 euros
- **Private transfer:** Pre-booked private car to city centre or Turku harbor in about 15 minutes, from around 45 euros

Shopping in Turku

Market Square: The primary shopping destination for fresh local produce, traditional Finnish foods (salmon, reindeer), handicrafts, and regional specialties. Open daily with extended hours on weekends.

Shopping Centers: Forum Marinum and other modern malls offer international brands and Finnish designers. Located within walking distance of city center.

Local Boutiques: Åbo Akademi Street and surrounding areas feature independent shops selling Finnish design, clothing, art, and unique souvenirs.

Finnish Design: Purchase iconic Nordic design pieces, Marimekko products, and contemporary furniture reflecting Finnish aesthetic principles.

Food Specialties: Buy Karelian pastries, reindeer meat, Arctic fish, Lakka liqueur, and other regional delicacies as authentic gifts or personal indulgences.

Bargaining: Not customary in Finland. Prices are fixed in shops and markets. Sales occur seasonally, primarily in January and July.

Annual Events & Celebrations

Turku Music Festival (August): Classical music performances in historic venues featuring international and Finnish artists. Transforms the city into a cultural hotspot.

Market Day Festival (July): Celebration of local culture, traditional crafts, folk performances, and historic demonstrations in Market Square and surrounding areas.

Christmas Markets (November-December): Festive markets with traditional crafts, warm mulled wine (glögi), gingerbread, and holiday decorations throughout Old Great Square.



Turku Medieval Fest (August): Recreation of medieval life with period costumes, traditional crafts, food, and entertainment celebrating the city's historic heritage.

Midsummer Celebrations (June): Festive events marking the summer solstice with bonfires, traditional foods, and cultural festivities unique to Nordic regions.

National Independence Day (December 6): Patriotic celebrations with parades, ceremonies, and traditional family gatherings throughout the city.

Sample 5-Day Itineraries

Day 1 - Historic Turku: Morning visit to Turku Castle with guided tour; lunch at Market Square tasting local specialties; afternoon at Cathedral Church exploring interior and climbing tower for city views; evening stroll along Aninkainen Park riverside.

Day 2 - Cultural Immersion: Morning at Aboa Vetus exploring medieval artifacts and comparing with contemporary art in Ars Nova; lunch at Åbo Akademi Street cafes; afternoon at Turku Art Museum; evening traditional Finnish sauna experience.

Day 3 - Natural Beauty: Bicycle tour of riverside paths to Sibelius Monument; lunch picnic in Sibelius Park; afternoon at Botanical Garden exploring seasonal plantings; sunset photography at various gardens; evening dinner cruise on Turku River.

Day 4 - Island Adventure: Full-day archipelago cruise exploring surrounding islands, pristine waterways, and isolated villages; seafood lunch onboard; learn about island maritime heritage; swimming and nature immersion in Nordic landscape.

Day 5 - Local Experiences: Morning visit to nearby Naantali town exploring Moomin World and charming harbor; traditional lunch in waterfront restaurant; afternoon exploring Ruissalo Island beaches and manor house; evening relaxation at local spa or café reflecting on memorable experiences.

Instagram & Photography Locations

Turku Cathedral at Sunset: Golden hour light illuminates the Gothic architecture beautifully. Best times: 9-10 PM during summer months. Shoot from Old Great Square for perfect framing against the tower.

Sibelius Monument: The striking steel structure creates dramatic silhouettes. Photography is excellent during all daylight hours, but morning light and blue-hour transitions offer unique perspectives.

Market Square Morning Light: Colorful market stalls and local vendors create vibrant compositions. Early morning (7-9 AM) offers best light and fewer crowds for cleaner shots.

Castle Riverside Reflections: Turku Castle reflects beautifully in the river during calm water conditions. Evening light creates dramatic castle silhouettes. Best 1-2 hours before sunset.

Botanical Garden Bloom Shots: Seasonal flowers offer excellent macro and landscape photography. May-June features peak blooms; autumn offers golden foliage compositions.

Aninkainen Park Waterside Paths: Tree-lined riverside paths create scenic Instagram-worthy compositions. Golden hour walks produce naturally beautiful lighting for portrait and landscape shots.

Old Great Square Architecture: Colorful building facades and historic architecture provide perfect urban photography. Overcast days offer even lighting for architectural details.

Electrical Information

Voltage: Finland operates on **230V AC, 50Hz** standard European electrical current.

Plug Types: Uses **Type F (Schuko) plugs** featuring two round pins in circular holes. This is the standard European socket configuration.



Adapters: Visitors from North America (110V, Type A/B plugs) require step-down voltage converters and plug adapters. Dual voltage appliances work without converters but still need compatible plugs.

USB Charging: Most modern hotels and accommodations include USB charging ports. Many cafes and public spaces provide USB charging facilities.

Power Outlets: Readily available in hotels, restaurants, and shopping centers. Bring extension cords if planning extended device charging or multiple device use.

Appliance Compatibility: Ensure devices are compatible with 230V before plugging in directly. Check wattage ratings and verify dual-voltage capability for safety.

Finnish Cuisine & Dining

Must-Try Dishes: **Karelian pastry** (savory pastry with rice filling), **reindeer steak** (tender and uniquely Nordic), **fresh salmon soup** (creamy and warming), **perch fish** (delicate white fish from Baltic waters), and **fresh cloudberries** (rare Nordic berries with unique flavor).

Local Restaurants: Turku offers diverse dining from casual market stalls to fine dining establishments. Market Square vendors provide affordable traditional food; Åbo Akademi Street features trendy cafes and casual bistros; riverside locations offer elegant dining with water views.

Coffee Culture: Finland has exceptional coffee tradition. Enjoy strong Nordic coffee at cozy cafes throughout the city, often accompanied by fresh pastries or cinnamon rolls (korvapuusti).

Sauna Dining: Experience traditional Finnish sauna culture with post-sauna meals featuring grilled fish, fresh salads, and local produce.

Seasonal Specialties: Summer offers fresh berries and outdoor grilling; autumn features game meats and mushrooms; winter highlights root vegetables and warming stews.

Dining Hours: Lunch typically 11 AM-2 PM; dinner 6-10 PM. Many restaurants open late for summer season and close early during winter months. Reservations recommended for dinner service.

Tourist Passes

Turku Card

An **all-inclusive tourist pass** providing free or discounted entry to major museums and attractions including Turku Castle, Aboa Vetus & Ars Nova, Art Museum, and other cultural sites. Includes unlimited public transportation (buses and trams) throughout the city. Available for 24, 48, or 72-hour periods. **Excellent value** for multi-day visitors planning to visit multiple attractions and utilize public transport extensively.

A **year-long museum pass** providing unlimited entry to participating museums nationwide. Ideal for repeat visitors and long-term travelers. Includes access to Turku's major museums and thousands of museums throughout Finland. One-time purchase provides extended value for cultural explorers.

Public Transport Ticket

Day tickets and travel cards for unlimited bus and tram travel. Available for single journeys or extended periods (1-7 days). Cost-effective for exploring the city without renting vehicles. Options include weekly cards offering unlimited city-wide access.
