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## Things to do in Rhodes

### Landmarks & Monuments

Rhodes is home to iconic historical structures that tell the story of Greek civilization, from medieval fortifications to ancient wonders recognized worldwide.

#### Palace of the Grand Masters Must See

2-3 hours No Booking Needed

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A stunning castle fortress built by the Knights Hospitaller in the 14th century, featuring medieval architecture with ornate decorations, grand halls, and panoramic city views. The palace showcases two centuries of Crusader occupation with intricate mosaics and period furnishings.



#### Medieval Old Town Must See

3-4 hours No Booking Needed

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A UNESCO World Heritage site with narrow winding streets, medieval buildings, ancient relics, and traditional architecture. Explore the Street of the Knights (Odos Ippoton), the Jewish Quarter, and the Turkish Quarter with their distinct cultural heritage and historic charm.



#### Suleiman Mosque Top Pick

30 minutes No Booking Needed

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Built in 1522 following the Ottoman siege, this elegant mosque features a striking red and white striped minaret, ornate interior decoration, and represents the island's Ottoman heritage. Still functioning as a place of worship with beautiful tilework and calligraphy.

### Tips for Landmarks & Monuments

- Visit the Palace early morning to avoid crowds and enjoy better photography lighting
- Wear comfortable walking shoes for exploring the Old Town's cobblestone streets
- Best photo angles of the Palace are from the gardens on the south side
- The Old Town gets extremely crowded in peak summer months (July-August)



## Museums & Galleries

Rhodes hosts world-class museums preserving ancient artifacts, medieval treasures, and contemporary art collections that chronicle the island's rich cultural heritage.



### Archaeological Museum of Rhodes Top Pick

2-3 hours No Booking Needed

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One of Greece's finest archaeological museums located in the Palace of Knights. Houses exceptional collections of Minoan, Hellenistic, and Roman artifacts including the famous marble sculptures, pottery, and bronze works. Notable exhibits feature treasures from ancient Lindos and Ialysos.

### Museum of Byzantine Art Notable

1.5-2 hours No Booking Needed

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Dedicated to Byzantine religious art and artifacts from the 7th to 15th centuries. Features an impressive collection of icons, manuscripts, sacred vessels, and ecclesiastical vestments representing the island's Christian heritage during Byzantine and medieval periods.

### Museum of Modern Greek Art Notable

1.5 hours No Booking Needed

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Contemporary and modern Greek artworks spanning from the 19th century to contemporary times. Features paintings, sculptures, and installations by prominent Greek artists, offering insight into Greece's artistic evolution and cultural expression.

## Tips for Museums & Galleries

- Many museums close for lunch between 1-5 PM; plan accordingly
- Combination tickets often available for multiple museums
- Photography restrictions may apply in religious artifact sections
- Hire a guide for deeper understanding of historical context



## Religious Sites

Rhodes reflects centuries of religious diversity with churches, synagogues, and mosques representing Christian, Jewish, and Muslim heritage across the island.

### Church of the Assumption Top Pick

45 minutes No Booking Needed

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Map

A stunning Byzantine church in the Old Town featuring beautiful marble columns, intricate mosaics, and ornate iconostasis. Built in the 15th century, this Orthodox church exemplifies medieval Byzantine architecture with its soaring dome and golden interior lighting.



### Kahal Shalom Synagogue Top Pick

1-1.5 hours No Booking Needed

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The oldest and most important Jewish synagogue in Rhodes, built in 1577 by Sephardic Jews. The synagogue features ornate chandeliers, hand-woven carpets, and a moving Holocaust memorial. The adjacent Jewish Museum documents the thriving pre-war Sephardic Jewish community with historical photographs and artifacts.

### Church of Saint Panteleimon Notable

30-45 minutes No Booking Needed

A beautifully restored Orthodox church in the Medieval Old Town with traditional Byzantine architecture, elaborate interior frescoes, and candlelit atmosphere. Known for its peaceful courtyard and authentic religious ceremonies conducted in Greek Orthodox tradition.

## Tips for Religious Sites

- Dress respectfully: cover shoulders and knees when entering active churches
- Avoid visiting during services unless you wish to participate
- Photography may be restricted in some religious sites
- The Jewish Quarter offers guided tours with historical context
- Arrive early for a peaceful experience before tour groups arrive



## Ancient & Historical Sites

Discover Rhodes' ancient past through remarkable archaeological sites featuring temples, acropolis ruins, and the legendary location of the Colossus of Rhodes, one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World.

### Lindos Acropolis Must See

2-3 hours No Booking Needed

Perched dramatically on a 116-meter cliff overlooking the sea, this ancient acropolis features ruins of the Temple of Athena Lindia, a Hellenistic stoa, and a medieval fortress. The commanding views span across Vlycha Bay and surrounding islands. A winding stone path with carved ancient steps leads to the summit for an unforgettable experience.

### Colossus of Rhodes Monument Must See

1-1.5 hours No Booking Needed

Marking the legendary location of one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World, the 56-foot bronze statue originally stood at the harbor entrance in the 3rd century BC. The modern monument site features informational displays, museums, and the impressive deer statues that mark the harbor. Though the original Colossus collapsed in an earthquake, its legacy remains iconic.

### Ancient Kamiros Top Pick

2-2.5 hours No Booking Needed

Extensively excavated ancient city ruins showcasing Hellenistic urban planning with streets, homes, temples, and an acropolis. Located on the west coast, this archaeological site provides excellent examples of classical city layout and architecture from the 6th century BC through Roman times.



### Valley of Butterflies (Petaloudes)

A scenic natural reserve in a lush valley where thousands of Jersey Tiger butterflies congregate seasonally (June-September). The peaceful valley features walking paths through dense vegetation, small waterfalls, and a cool microclimate that attracts these distinctive butterflies. An on-site museum explains the natural phenomenon and butterfly lifecycle.

## Tips for Ancient & Historical Sites

- Lindos Acropolis requires climbing many ancient steps; wear sturdy shoes
- Bring water and sun protection; limited shade on exposed ruins
- Visit Lindos early morning or late afternoon to avoid midday heat and crowds
- Ancient Kamiros has minimal facilities; bring supplies
- Valley of Butterflies is best visited mid-morning when butterflies are most active
- Consider hiring a guide for deeper historical context



## Squares & Streets

Experience the vibrant public spaces of Rhodes where locals gather, history unfolds, and traditional Mediterranean life thrives amid historic architecture and modern amenities.

### Street of the Knights (Odos Ippoton) Must See

One of Europe's best-preserved medieval streets featuring ornate stone facades of 15th-century mansions built by Knights from different European nations. The steeply sloping street is lined with impressive heraldic shields, arched doorways, and period architectural details that transport visitors directly to the medieval era.

### Symi Square (Plateia Rimini) Top Pick

1-2 hours No Booking Needed

The heart of Rhodes Old Town featuring a beautiful stone fountain with a bronze deer statue, surrounded by medieval architecture and lively cafes. The square pulses with energy throughout the day, hosting locals and tourists enjoying traditional Greek food and strong coffee. Excellent for people-watching and soaking in authentic Mediterranean atmosphere.

### Hippocrates Square Top Pick

1-1.5 hours No Booking Needed

A charming plaza in the heart of the Old Town dominated by a sprawling ancient plane tree, believed to have been planted by Hippocrates himself. Surrounded by traditional tavernas, cafes, and shops selling local crafts, this square epitomizes Greek island charm with its tree-shaded seating and historical significance.

### Sokratous Street Top Pick

A lively pedestrian shopping street in the Old Town connecting major squares and featuring a vibrant mix of traditional shops, modern boutiques, tavernas, and gelato stands. The narrow stone-paved street captures the essence of Greek island commerce with locals and tourists mingling throughout the day.

## Tips for Squares & Streets

- Explore streets early morning (before 9 AM) for authentic local atmosphere
- Wear comfortable shoes for extensive walking on uneven medieval cobblestones
- Get lost intentionally in the winding streets to discover hidden courtyards and local tavernas
- Shopping streets are most crowded in afternoon and early evening
- Street photography is excellent; medieval architecture creates dramatic shadows throughout the day

### Jewish Quarter (Evraiki)

A poignant historic district preserving Sephardic Jewish heritage with narrow winding streets, traditional buildings, and the important Kahal Shalom Synagogue. The quarter tells the story of a thriving community that flourished for centuries before the Holocaust. Street plaques commemorate victims and buildings feature traditional Jewish architecture elements.



### Turkish Quarter (Arabo)

### Mandraki Harbor District

The modern waterfront area featuring the historic harbor where ships operated for centuries, the iconic harbor deer statues marking the Colossus location, and contemporary restaurants with sea views. This bustling area combines maritime history with modern amenities, perfect for sunset dining and evening promenades along the water.

## Tips for Neighborhoods & Districts

- Best explored on foot for discovering hidden passages and local life
- Respect local residents and be mindful when photographing in residential areas
- Join locals at neighborhood kafes (cafes) for authentic Greek coffee
- Many restaurants in older quarters offer excellent traditional food at fair prices
- Quieter neighborhoods reveal more authentic Rhodes away from tourist crowds

The area features restaurants and sits within forested highlands offering escape from coastal heat.

## Tips for Day Trips & Excursions

- Book island ferries early, especially in summer when spots fill quickly
- Bring passport for international excursions (Turkey)
- Pack light bags for boat excursions; secure luggage available at hotels
- Ferry schedules vary seasonally; confirm departure times day before
- Sea conditions may cause cancellations in winter; always have backup plans
- Wear protective clothing on boats; sea spray can be strong

## Practical Information

### Best Seasons for Rhodes

**April-May (Spring):** Ideal weather with temperatures 20-25°C, wildflowers blooming, and fewer tourists. Perfect for exploring archaeological sites without midday heat intensity.

**September-October (Fall):** Pleasant temperatures 25-28°C, sea water still warm, and fewer crowds post-summer season. Excellent for beach and water activities.



**July-August (Peak Summer):** Hottest period (32-35°C) with maximum tourists. Beaches and attractions extremely crowded, but ideal for swimming. Plan indoor activities during peak afternoon hours.

**November-March (Winter):** Mild 12-16°C but frequent rain. Some attractions reduce hours; ferry schedules less frequent. Excellent for solitary exploration and local interaction.

**Avoid:** Mid-July through mid-August for crowds-averse travelers. Winter for beach activities.

## Getting Around Rhodes

**Arriving by Air:** Rhodes International Airport (RHO) serves frequent flights from Europe. Taxis, buses, and car rental available. Journey to city center approximately 15 km (20-30 minutes).

**Public Buses:** Reliable network (RODA company) with routes to major towns and beaches. Buy tickets at booths (€1.50-3 within Rhodes). Frequent service during summer, reduced winter schedules.

**Taxis:** Readily available with meter systems. Airport to city center approximately €25-30. Agree on fares beforehand for longer journeys.

**Car Rental:** Multiple agencies at airport and town center. Standard rates €25-50 daily. Driving is on right side; roads generally good quality. Parking available throughout city.

**Scooters/Motorcycles:** Popular for exploring; €20-40 daily rental. Helmets required by law.

**Ferries:** Daily service to Symi (45 minutes), seasonal to Turkish coast and other islands.

**Walking:** Old Town fully pedestrian-friendly; excellent for exploration on foot.

### ➔ Airport Transfer

**Rhodes International Airport Diagoras (RHO)** to city center:

- **KTEL Public Bus:** Runs to Rhodes Town in about 25 minutes, tickets around 2.50 euros
- **Taxi:** Fixed rate of roughly 25 to 30 euros to Rhodes Town, about 20 minutes
- **Private Transfer:** Prebooked door-to-door transfer to hotels in Rhodes Town for around 35 to 40 euros, about 20 minutes
- **Rental Car:** Major agencies operate desks at arrivals, roughly 20 minutes to Rhodes Town with rates from about 25 euros per day

## Shopping & Local Products

**Traditional Souvenirs:** Sokratous Street and Old Town bazaar offer ceramics, textiles, leather goods, and handicrafts. Quality varies; bargaining acceptable at smaller vendors.

**Local Products:** Extra virgin olive oil (high-quality local varieties), Greek wine, liqueurs (ouzo, raki), honey, and nuts. Purchase at markets or specialty shops for authenticity.

**Textiles & Embroidery:** Traditional Greek weavings and hand-embroidered items from local artisans. Prices fair; small vendors offer personalized service.

**Jewelry:** Gold, silver, and Byzantine-inspired pieces available throughout Old Town. Verify authenticity at established shops.

**Shopping Hours:** Most shops 9 AM-2 PM, then 5 PM-9 PM. Many close 2-5 PM. Sunday hours vary; closed Sundays in many smaller shops.

**Markets:** Public market near harbor provides fresh produce, local cheeses, and traditional foods. Morning shopping offers best selection.

**Bargaining Etiquette:** Expected at souvenir shops and street vendors, but not in modern retail stores. Always polite and respectful; 10-20% negotiation typical.



## Annual Events & Celebrations

**Easter (Variable March-April):** Greek Orthodox celebrations with religious processions, special church services, and traditional feasts. Major cultural event throughout island.

**May Day (May 1):** Celebrations with flower wreaths, traditional foods, and street festivities across Rhodes.

**Symi Festival (Summer):** Cultural celebration on nearby Symi Island with traditional music, dance, and maritime heritage events.

**Rhodes International Festival (July-August):** Theater productions, concerts, and cultural performances in historic venues including Palace gardens.

**Dormition of the Virgin (August 15):** Religious holiday with processions, family gatherings, and traditional celebrations in villages and towns.

**September 14:** Pilgrimage to Tsambika Monastery celebrating the icon of the Virgin Mary.

**Local Village Celebrations:** Smaller communities celebrate patron saints with traditional food festivals, music, and dancing throughout year.

**New Year (January 1):** Celebrations with special foods and family traditions.

## Sample 5-Day Itinerary

**Day 1 - Medieval Old Town Immersion:** Morning exploring Palace of Grand Masters and surrounding Medieval Old Town. Afternoon wandering Street of the Knights and Symi Square. Evening sunset from harbor area, dinner at traditional taverna in Old Town. Evening activity: watch sunset over Mandraki harbor.

**Day 2 - Ancient Heritage:** Early morning visit Lindos Acropolis with dramatic coastal views. Afternoon at nearby Vlycha Bay for swimming and relaxation. Late afternoon exploring Lindos town whitewashed architecture. Dinner at beachfront taverna in Lindos with fresh seafood specialties.

**Day 3 - Archaeological Exploration:** Morning at Archaeological Museum viewing ancient treasures and artifacts. Afternoon visiting Ancient Kamiros ruins and Valley of Butterflies (seasonal). Late afternoon in Rodini Park. Relaxed evening in modern city center exploring contemporary Rhodes.

**Day 4 - Island Adventure:** Full-day boat tour to nearby Symi Island including Panormitis Monastery, swimming stops, and waterfront lunch at local taverna. Return evening in Mandraki harbor. Optional sunset walk and evening gelato.

**Day 5 - Cultural Blend & Relaxation:** Morning in Jewish Quarter and Kahal Shalom Synagogue learning Sephardic heritage. Afternoon relaxing at city beach or visiting Seven Springs (Epta Piges) for swimming in natural springs. Evening leisurely stroll through Turkish Quarter exploring Ottoman heritage. Final evening dinner overlooking harbor.

## Best Photography Locations

**Palace of Grand Masters:** South gardens provide dramatic architectural photos. Early morning light casts interesting shadows on facades. Late afternoon golden hour excellent for backlighting and silhouettes.

**Street of the Knights:** Dramatic perspective photos of medieval facades in golden hour light. Cloudy days offer even lighting without harsh shadows on stone details.

**Lindos Acropolis:** Pre-dawn arrival captures sunrise behind temple ruins. Late afternoon golden light illuminates white buildings with dramatic cliff shadows. Aerial views from paragliding shots stunning.

**Mandraki Harbor:** Iconic deer statues with sunset backdrop create postcard-perfect images. Dawn light reflects beautifully in calm harbor waters. Evening lights illuminate waterfront restaurants.

**Symi Island (Day Trip):** Colorful harbor houses reflecting in water create vivid compositions. Early morning before tourist boats arrive offers peaceful, clear images. Elevated viewpoints capture entire harbor panorama.



**Simi Square & Hippocrates Tree:** Morning shade provides even light for architectural details. Tree-framed shots of surrounding buildings create layered compositions. People photography captures authentic local life.

**Best Times:** Golden hour (dawn 6-7 AM, dusk 7-8 PM) provides warmest light and interesting shadows. Avoid harsh midday sun 12-3 PM. Overcast conditions ideal for texture and detail photography without shadows.

## Electrical Information

**Voltage & Frequency:** Greece operates on 230 volts (V) at 50 hertz (Hz), standard throughout European Union.

**Plug Types:** Type C (2-round pins) and Type F (2-round pins with grounding clips) are standard. Older Type E sockets exist in some buildings.

**Adapter Requirements:** North American devices (110V) require voltage converter; UK/AU/NZ devices compatible at 230V with plug adapter. Most modern electronics (phones, laptops) auto-convert 110-240V.

**Adapters & Converters:** Available at airport shops, electronics stores, and hotels. Bring adapters from home to ensure compatibility. Consider portable power banks for extended sightseeing.

**Practical Tips:** Test electronics at hotel before extended use. High-power devices (hairdryers) may require dedicated circuits. Carry spare batteries for cameras given extended exploration hours.

**USB Charging:** Many hotels and restaurants offer USB charging stations; ask staff if unsure. Power banks readily available for purchase if needed.

## Must-Try Dining Experiences

**Fresh Seafood:** Rhodes specializes in grilled octopus (chtapodi), mussels, shrimp, and daily catch. Waterfront tavernas near Mandraki offer best selections. Request 'catch of the day' for freshest options.

**Local Specialties:** Souvlaki (grilled meat skewers), moussaka (layered eggplant casserole), pastitsio (pasta bake), and saganaki (fried cheese). Traditional bakeries serve warm spanakopita (spinach pie).

**Mezze & Appetizers:** Tzatziki (yogurt-cucumber dip), taramosalata (fish roe), hummus, dolmades (stuffed grape leaves), and salade Horiatiki (Greek salad with feta).

**Street Food:** Souvlaki sandwiches, gyros, and koulouri (sesame ring bread) inexpensively available from street vendors.

**Desserts:** Baklava (phyllo pastry with honey), galaktoboureko (custard pastry), traditional Greek yogurt with honey, and loukoumades (honey donuts).

**Local Wine & Drinks:** Rhodian wines offer excellent value; ouzo (anise liqueur) traditional after-meal drink. Local beers equally refreshing.

**Dining Tips:** Lunch typically 1-4 PM, dinner 8-11 PM. Water always complimentary. Service charge included; small tip appreciated (5-10%). Waterfront restaurants pricier but offer ambiance; neighborhood tavernas provide better value with authentic cuisine.

## Tourist Passes

### Rhodes Tourist Card

Multi-day pass providing discounted entry to major attractions including Lindos Acropolis, Valley of Butterflies, Archaeological Museum, and Byzantine Museum. Typically saves 20-30% on individual ticket costs. Cards valid 3-7 days depending on package purchased. Available at tourism offices and hotels.
