- Combine visits with nearby shopping districts
- Allow extra time during peak tourist seasons

### National Museum of Kenya

## Practical Information

### Optimal Seasons

**Dry Seasons:** June-October (long dry) and January-February (short dry) offer excellent weather and wildlife viewing. Temperatures range 15-25°C with minimal rainfall and clear visibility for safari activities.

**Wet Seasons:** March-May and November-December bring lush landscapes, bird migrations, and fewer tourists, though occasional rain disrupts activities. Temperatures 18-28°C; roads remain accessible.

**Best Overall:** July-October and January-February provide optimal conditions for wildlife viewing, outdoor activities, and comfortable exploration.

### Getting Around Nairobi

**Taxis & Ride-Sharing:** Uber and Bolt operate extensively in Nairobi; reliable, metered options available 24/7. White-and-black taxis provide traditional service; negotiate fares beforehand.

**Public Transport:** Extensive matatu (minibus) system connects neighborhoods economically; routes comprehensive though schedules informal. BRT buses provide modern public transit on major corridors.

**Car Rental:** Several agencies offer self-drive options; international driving permit required. Roads well-maintained; traffic congested during rush hours (7-9am, 4-7pm).

**Airport Transfer:** Jomo Kenyatta International Airport (JKIA) 18km southeast; airport shuttles, pre-arranged transfers, and ride-sharing available. Approximately 45-60 minutes depending on traffic.

- **Airport Shuttle Bus:** Scheduled shuttle to city center hotels in about 45 minutes, roughly KES 1,000 per person
- **Uber or Bolt:** Ride-hailing app taxi to the CBD in 30 to 50 minutes depending on traffic, around KES 1,200 to 2,000
- **Airport Taxi:** Official metered taxi rank outside arrivals to city center in about 40 minutes, fixed rate near KES 2,500 to 3,000
- **Private Transfer:** Pre-booked private car with driver to city center or Karen suburb in 30 to 60 minutes, roughly USD 30 to 45



## Shopping Guide

**What to Buy:** Hand-carved wooden sculptures, Maasai beaded jewelry, traditional textiles, leather goods, local artwork, coffee, tea, and spices authentic to Kenya.

**Shopping Areas:** Westgate and other major malls offer modern retail; Nairobi City Market provides authentic local goods; artisan cooperatives like Kazuri offer ethical handcrafts.

**Bargaining:** Traditional markets expect negotiation; expect 20-30% discounts. Modern shops have fixed pricing. Bargain respectfully; building rapport improves deals.

**Operating Hours:** Malls 10am-8pm (extended weekends); markets 6am-6pm; smaller shops 9am-7pm typically.

## Annual Events

**Nairobi Fashion Week:** October showcase of East African designers, contemporary trends, and cultural fashion expressions.

**Nairobi International Book Fair:** September celebration of literature, author meetings, and literary culture with publishers, authors, and readers.

**Kenya Music Festival:** July-August showcasing traditional and contemporary Kenyan music, dance, and performing arts.

**National Holidays:** January 1 (New Year), April 10 (Good Friday varies), May 1 (Labour Day), June 1 (Madaraka Day), October 20 (Kenyatta Day), December 25 (Christmas). These affect shop hours and attraction availability.
