Tours & Activities

- Summer (December-February) offers longer daylight for hiking
- The gondola is a quick way to experience high-altitude views without strenuous hiking
- Book ski accommodations well in advance for winter season
- Water activities are weather-dependent—check conditions before booking
- Wetsuit rental is recommended even in summer for comfort
- Early morning cruises offer the best lighting for photography
- Lake Wakatipu is pristine—respect the natural environment

Practical Information

Best Time to Visit Queenstown

Summer (December-February): Peak season with warm weather (15-25°C), extended daylight, perfect for hiking, water sports, and outdoor activities. Expect crowds and higher prices.

Autumn (March-May): Mild weather with stunning golden foliage in Arrowtown, fewer crowds, and comfortable hiking conditions. Excellent photography opportunities.

Winter (June-August): Snow transforms the landscape, ski season at The Remarkables operates, and stunning winter scenery. Cold temperatures and shorter daylight hours.

Spring (September-November): Warming temperatures, spring flowers blooming, and comfortable outdoor conditions. Transitional weather with increasing adventure activity availability.



Getting Around Queenstown

Airport Transfer: Queenstown Airport is 20 minutes from town. Shuttle services, rental cars, and ride-sharing available. Many hotels offer shuttle services.

Public Transport: Bus system (Atomica) connects central Queenstown with accommodations and attractions. Frequent services during day, limited evening routes.

Rental Cars: Ideal for exploring nearby attractions, day trips, and scenic drives. New Zealand drives on the left side. Roads are generally good quality but can be winding.

Taxis and Ride-Sharing: Uber and local taxi services available for point-to-point transportation. Convenient for nightlife and restaurant visits.

Walking: Downtown Queenstown is compact and pedestrian-friendly. Most central attractions are within walking distance.

Water Taxi: Ferry services available to Glenorchy and scenic lake cruises depart from Steamer Wharf.

➔ Airport Transfer

Queenstown Airport (ZQN) to city center:

- **Airport Bus (Ride Queenstown):** Shuttle service to central Queenstown in about 15 to 20 minutes, around NZD 12 one way
- **Shared Shuttle Transfer:** Door to door van transfer to hotels in 15 to 25 minutes, roughly NZD 20 to 25 per person
- **Taxi:** Metered taxi to the town center in about 10 to 15 minutes, typically NZD 35 to 45
- **Private Transfer:** Pre booked private car to Queenstown or Frankton lodgings in 10 to 20 minutes, from around NZD 70 to 90

Shopping and Souvenirs

What to Buy: New Zealand jade (pounamu), Merino wool products, honey, native bird art, handmade jewelry, outdoor gear, and local craft items make excellent souvenirs.

Shopping Areas: Mall Street features boutique shops, outdoor retailers, and specialty stores. Steamer Wharf offers tourist-oriented shops. Arrowtown has antique shops and galleries.

Markets: Saturday farmers markets offer fresh produce and artisanal goods. Seasonal craft markets feature local artisans.

Bargaining: Not customary in New Zealand. Prices are fixed. Some larger purchases may qualify for discounts if paying in cash.

Duty-Free: Queenstown Airport offers duty-free shopping on international items before departure.

Festivals and Events

Arrowtown Autumn Festival (March/April): Celebrates golden autumn colors with music, food, and cultural events in picturesque Arrowtown.

Queenstown Winter Festival (July/August): Winter sports events, snow activities, parties, and entertainment during ski season.

The Remarkables Runathon (September): Mountain running event attracting athletes from around the world.

Queenstown Summer Festival (December/January): Music performances, cultural events, and family activities celebrating summer season.

National Holiday (ANZAC Day - April 25): Commemoration services. Shops may have limited hours.



Queen's Birthday (First Monday in June) : National public holiday affecting shop hours and service availability.

5-Day Sample Itinerary

Day 1 - Adventure and Orientation : Arrive and settle in. Ride Queenstown Gondola for sunset views. Explore downtown Mall Street and Steamer Wharf. Dinner at lakeside restaurant with mountain views. Evening stroll around downtown.

Day 2 - Extreme Adventure : Morning bungy jump at Kawarau Bridge or tandem skydive with aerial views. Lunch and relaxation. Afternoon jet boating through Shotover River canyons. Evening at casual bar with live music.

Day 3 - Scenic Day Trip : Full-day Milford Sound cruise departing early morning. Experience fjords, waterfalls, and wildlife. Return evening with stunning scenery throughout. Dinner and early rest.

Day 4 - Mountains and Culture : Morning hike Ben Lomond Track or scenic Gondola ride. Afternoon exploring Queenstown Museum and local art galleries. Evening wine tasting at local brewery or winery. Dinner at fine dining restaurant.

Day 5 - Relaxation and Exploration : Morning at farmers market. Scenic drive to Arrowtown, explore town galleries and cafes. Kayaking or paddleboarding on Lake Wakatipu. Final dinner at favorite restaurant. Prepare for departure.

Best Photography Locations

Queenstown Gondola Summit (Bob's Peak) : Sunrise or sunset golden hour offers 360-degree panoramic shots of Lake Wakatipu, Remarkables Mountains, and surrounding peaks. Clear early mornings provide best visibility. Spring/summer offer extended golden hours.

Roys Peak Track Lookout : Iconic shot of Lake Wanaka surrounded by mountains. Early morning or late afternoon light. Autumn (March-May) adds golden foliage. Requires 5-6 hour hike but worth the effort.

Arrowtown Autumn Colors : Tree-lined streets with golden willows and poplars. Shoot in morning or late afternoon for warm light. Peak foliage March-May. Streets are busiest weekends—visit weekdays for fewer crowds.

Glenorchy and Paradise Villages : Mountains reflected in still lake waters at sunrise. Dramatic peaks and pristine wilderness. Early morning offers smoothest water reflections and best light.

Lake Wakatipu Sunset : Downtown lakeside promenades provide easy access to sunset shots. Steamer Wharf offers reflections of boats and lights. Carry tripod for extended exposure evening shots.

Milford Sound Fjord : Waterfalls cascading from granite cliffs surrounded by rainforest. Cruise ships offer varied vantage points. Moody overcast weather adds dramatic atmosphere—don't wait for perfect sun.

Electricity and Power

Voltage : New Zealand uses 230V, 50Hz electrical standard.

Plug Types : New Zealand uses Type I plugs (distinctive flat angled pins in triangular configuration) and some Type A outlets.

Adapters : Travelers from US (Type A), Europe (Type C), or other countries must bring appropriate plug adapters. Universal adapters supporting Type I are recommended.

Outlet Availability : Most hotels and accommodations have outlets in rooms. Hostels provide shared charging areas. USB charging ports increasingly available in modern establishments.

Voltage Converters : For devices rated only for 110V, voltage converters may be necessary. Most modern phone/laptop chargers are dual-voltage.



Power Reliability: Electricity is reliable in Queenstown with rare outages. Remote adventure locations may have generator power or solar alternatives.

Must-Try Dishes and Dining Tips

Venison and Game: Try local deer venison, wild boar, and other game meats unique to New Zealand. Lean, flavorful meat prepared in contemporary dishes.

Salmon and Seafood: Fresh-caught salmon, whitebait, and local fish feature on restaurant menus. Coastal preparations showcase New Zealand's seafood excellence.

Pavlova: Iconic Kiwi dessert of meringue with whipped cream and fresh berries. Light, sweet, and perfect after meals.

Meat Pies: Traditional New Zealand handheld pies with savory fillings. Excellent casual lunch option from bakeries.

L&P (Lemon & Paeroa): Iconic New Zealand lemon soda beverage. Sweet, refreshing soft drink unique to the country.

Coffee Culture: New Zealand has excellent flat whites and specialty coffee. Cafes are social hubs—arrive early for seating during busy periods.

Dining Tips: Lunch typically 12-2pm, dinner 6-10pm. Tipping is appreciated (10-15%) but not obligatory. Many restaurants accept card payments. Vegetarian options readily available at most establishments. Book restaurants in advance during peak season.
